- 136 (c) The state auditor may audit each institution to verify that the moneys collected by 137 the institutions from contributors are used for scholastic scholarships.
  - (d) After an applicant has been issued collegiate license plates or renewal decals, the commission shall charge the institution whose plate was issued, a fee determined in accordance with Section 63-38-3.2 for management and administrative expenses incurred in issuing and renewing the collegiate license plates.

## H.B. 445 - Utah Housing Opportunity Special Group License Plate

## **Fiscal Note**

## **State Impact**

Enactment of this bill will require a one-time appropriation of \$8,200 from dedicated credits to the Division of Motor Vehicles for set-up and production costs, based on an initial order of 500 sets of 3-color plates. Restricted fund revenue of \$15,000 is anticipated, which will be deposited in a new Housing Opportunity Restricted Account in the General Fund and appropriated to the Division of Real Estate to be distributed among charitable organizations as defined in the bill.

## Individual, Business and/or Local Impact

Enactment of this bill likely will not result in direct, measurable costs and/or benefits for individuals, businesses, or local governments. Individuals wishing to obtain the special group license plates must pay a \$5 per plate new plate fee and contribute a \$30 per year to the Utah Housing Opportunity Restricted Account. The Division of Real Estate is to distribute these funds to organizations that provide affordable housing, as defined in the bill.
