Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:	
Section 1. Section 41-6a-610 is enacted to read:	
41-6a-610. Definitions Automated red light traffic enforcement Restrictions	
on use.	
(1) As used in this section, "automated red light traffic enforcement system" means an	
electronic system consisting of a photographic, video, or electronic camera and a vehicle sensor	
installed to work in conjunction with a traffic control device to automatically produce	
photographs, video, or digital images of a vehicle moving in violation of the traffic control	
device.	
(2) An automated red light traffic enforcement system may be used if:	
(a) use of an automated red light traffic enforcement system by a local highway	
authority is approved by the local highway authority's governing body;	
(b) the citation is accompanied by the photographs or digital images meeting the	
requirements of Subsection (3) produced by the automated red light traffic enforcement system	
at the time of the violation; and	
(c) the authorizing jurisdiction ensures, through written policy, the following:	
(i) a recipient of a citation is entitled to the same rights and obligations regarding	
appeal and dismissal of citations as otherwise provided for other citations issued under this	
chapter, including the right to appear before a hearing officer to challenge a citation; and	
(ii) a citation issued under this section is issued according to the same guidelines that	
an officer would apply when determining whether or not to issue a citation for another	
violation under this chapter.	
(3) The photographs or images produced by an automated red light traffic enforcement	
system shall include:	
(a) a photograph or digital image of the operator of the motor vehicle; and	
(b) a photograph or digital image of the license plate of the motor vehicle.	
(4) The restrictions under Subsection (2) on the use of an automated red light traffic
