Enactment of this bill will appropriate \$872,400 in ongoing funding from the Education Fund, with \$375,000 going to Weber State and \$497,400 going to Utah State. In addition, \$865,000 in one-time Education Funds will go to Weber State (\$100,000) and Utah State (\$765,000) in FY 2008. This is to establish an electrical engineering program in partnership between Utah State University and Weber State University.
