license plate shall [be in colors selected by the commission and shall] have displayed on it:
(i) the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which it is issued;
(ii) the name of the state; <u>and</u>
(iii) a registration decal showing the date of expiration[; and] displayed in accordance
with Subsection (6).
[(iv) a slogan determined as provided in Section 41-1a-405.]
[(b) A special group license plate issued under Section 41-1a-418 is exempt from the
