WHEREAS, the National Conference of State Legislatures established America's Legislators Back to School Program, a bipartisan program for legislators across the nation to impart greater understanding of the necessity for debate, negotiation, and compromise in the legislative process of developing effective public policy, and to engage future voters and leaders in a dialogue about the value of representative democracy and to adapt to each individual state;

WHEREAS, this civic education program helps to instill the values of representative democracy, strengthen the democratic process, and encourage students to play a responsible role in their government; and

WHEREAS, Utah legislators ranked number one in the nation for participation in this program during the 2005-06 school year:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, the Governor concurring therein, emphasize and urge support of civic education to promote greater understanding of government and the role of legislators in representative democracy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and the Governor recognize Utah's Legislators Back to School Program and urge each member of the Legislature to visit students in classrooms during the school year.
