Mr. Speaker:

The Political Subdivisions Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 347**, MUNICIPAL ELECTION LAW PROVISIONS, by Representative D. Aagard, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 15 through 18:
 - 15 modifies provisions governing the days and hours of poll operation for early voting
 - in <u>local special elections</u>, municipal primary elections <u>a</u> and municipal general elections;
 - 17 {→ provides that use of machines that provide disability access is not required for early
 - 18 voting in municipal primary elections and municipal elections;
- 2. *Page 1, Lines 22 through 27:*
 - primary elections or municipal general elections; and
 - permits poll workers who are assigned to a voting precinct during a municipal
 - 24 election to reside within the county, rather than within the precinct they are assigned
 - 25 to $\{ \frac{1}{1}$ and
 - 26

 adjusts the deadline for filing declarations of candidacy and nomination petitions for
 - 27 municipal elections from August to July .
- 3. Page 15, Lines 433 through 437:
 - 433 (c) During the early voting period, the election officer:
 - 434 (i) for <u>local special elections</u>, <u>municipal primary elections</u>, <u>and municipal</u> general elections:
 - (A) shall conduct early voting on a minimum of four days during each week of the
 - 436 early voting period; and







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(B) shall conduct early voting on the last day of the early voting period; and

4. Page 15, Lines 459 through 461:

- (c) { for all elections other than municipal primary elections and municipal general
- 460 <u>elections</u>, at least 10% of the voting devices at a polling place are accessible for individuals
- with disabilities in accordance with Public Law 107-252, the Help America Vote Act of 2002;

5. Page 17, Lines 497 through 498:

- (b) Nothing in this title shall be construed to require the use of electronic voting
- devices in <u>local special elections</u>, <u>municipal primary elections</u> <u>, or municipal general elections</u>.

6. Page 20, Lines 612 through 614:

- 612 (i) file a declaration of candidacy, in person with the city recorder or town clerk, during
- office hours and not later than 5 p.m. between $\{+\}$ July $\{+\}$ $\{-\}$ July $\{+\}$ 15 and $\{-\}$ August $\{+\}$ $\{-\}$ July 15 of any
- odd-numbered year; and

7. *Page 21, Lines 629 through 635:*

- 629 (c) Any resident of a municipality may nominate a candidate for a municipal office by:
- 630 (i) filing a nomination petition with the city recorder or town clerk during office hours,
- but not later than 5 p.m. between {+} July {+} {June} 15 and {+} August {+} 15 of any odd-numbered
- 632 year; and [pay]
- 633 (ii) paying the filing fee, if one is required by municipal ordinance.







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634 (d) When {+} August {+} 15 is a Saturday [or], Sunday, or holiday, the filing time shall

be extended until 5 p.m. on the following [Monday] regular business day.
