H.B. 29 Professional Employer Organization Related Amendments (Rep. J. Dunnigan)

Rep. Dunnigan introduced the bill to the committee with the assistance of Bill Pendleton, Chair, Utah Leadership Council, National Association of Professional Employer Organizations.

H.B. 80 Health Insurance Amendments (Rep. J. Dunnigan)

Rep. Dunnigan introduced the bill to the committee with the assistance of Tomi Ossana, Executive Director, Health Insurance Pool of Utah.

 - 254 (b) Notwithstanding {Subsections} Subsection {(1) and } (2)(a), a HIPAA eligible individual is not

 - 350 established by the board.
