H.B. 100 Accessing Pornography on School Property (*Rep. D. Bowman*)

- **MOTION:** Rep. Holdaway moved to amend the bill as follows:
- 1. Page 4, Lines 90 through 95
 - 90 (2) Except as provided in Subsection (3), a person {, including a minor, } is guilty of
 - 91 <u>accessing pornographic or indecent material on school property when the person willfully</u> <u>or</u>
 - 92 <u>knowingly creates, views</u>, {<u>listens to</u>,} <u>or otherwise gains access to pornographic or</u> <u>indecent</u>
 - 93 <u>material while present on school property</u> <u>, under circumstances not amounting to an</u> <u>attempted or actual violation of:</u>

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	(a) distributing pornographic material as specified in Section 76-10-1204;
	(b) inducing acceptance of pornographic material as specified in Section 76-10-

(4) Each separate offense under this section is :
(a) a class A misdemeanor if the person is 18 years of age or older; and
