H.B. 177 Correctional Facility Bidding Process - Privatization of Correctional

Facilities (Rep. G. Hughes)

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- 32 (1) On or before January 1, 2008, the department shall complete a study regarding the
- 33 <u>issuance of requests for proposals for the construction of a 500-bed</u> <u>private</u> correctional facility that is to address
- 34 <u>inmate housing needs, including preventing the early release of inmates due to an</u> inadequate

H.B. 354 Bus Passenger Safety Act Amendments (Rep. M. Walker)

- 1. Page 2, Lines 46 through 48:
 - 46 (b) The prohibition of Subsection (4)(a) does not apply to:
 - 47 (i) { elected or appointed peace officers or commercial security personnel who are in
 - 48 possession of weapons or firearms used in the course and scope of their

 employment | individuals listed in Subsections 76-10-523(1)(a),(b),(c),(d), and

 (e) [, or];

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- 2. *Page 3, Lines 70 through 72:*
 - 70 (2) [Any] (a) A person who carries a concealed dangerous weapon, firearm, or any
 - 71 { explosive, } highly inflammable or hazardous materials or devices into a terminal or aboard a bus
 - 72 [shall be] is guilty of a third degree felony.

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Dee, Rep. Litvack, Rep. Lockhart, Rep. Morley, and Rep. Wiley absent for the vote.
