This bill creates a program to award scholarships to paraeducators for education and							
training to become a licensed teacher.							
Highlighted Provisions:							
This bill:							
 creates the Paraeducator to Teacher Scholarship Program which provides 							
scholarships of up to $\$ \rightarrow [\$10,000] \$5,000 \leftarrow \$$ to paraeducators employed by school districts and							
charter schools who are pursuing an associate's degree or bachelor's degree to							
become a licensed teacher;							
provides that scholarship monies may only be used for tuition costs for:							
 an associate's degree program that fulfills credit requirements for the first two 							
years of a bachelor's degree program leading to teacher licensure; or							
 the first two years of a bachelor's degree program leading to teacher licensure; 							
and							
directs the State Board of Education to:							
 establish a committee to select scholarship recipients; and 							
 make rules to administer the Paraeducator to Teacher Scholarship Program.

44	(1) delivers instruction under the direct supervision of a teacher; and

47	Section 2. Section 53A-6-802 is enacted to read:

49	(1) The Paraeducator to Teacher Scholarship Program is created to award scholarships
