	Section 1. Section <b>26-6-3</b> is amended to read:
	26-6-3. Authority to investigate and control epidemic infections and
	communicable disease.
	(1) The department has authority to investigate and control the causes of epidemic
	infections and communicable disease, and shall provide for the detection, reporting, prevention,
	and control of communicable diseases and epidemic infections or any other health hazard which
may affect the public health.	
	(2) (a) As part of the requirements of Subsection (1), the department shall distribute to
	the public and to health care professionals:
	(i) medically accurate information about sexually transmitted diseases that may cause
	infertility and sterility if left untreated, including descriptions of:
	(A) the probable side effects resulting from an untreated sexually transmitted disease,
	including infertility and sterility;
	(B) medically accepted treatment for sexually transmitted diseases;
	(C) the medical risks commonly associated with the medical treatment of sexually
	transmitted diseases; and
	(D) suggest screening by a private physician; and
	(ii) information about:
	(A) public services and agencies available to assist individuals with obtaining treatment
