**General Description:**

This bill amends the Medical Assistance Act in the Health Code.

This bill:

- ▶ requires the state Medicaid program to allow the use of telemedicine for certain services that are otherwise reimbursable under the state Medicaid plan; and
- ▶ provides guidelines for reimbursing for telemedicine services.

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*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

Section 1. Section **26-18-12** is enacted to read:



28 26-18-12. Telemedicine -- Reimbursement -- Disclosure.

29 (1) (a) On or after July 1, 2008, communication by telemedicine is considered face to  
30 face contact between a health care provider and a patient under the state's medical assistance  
31 program if:

32 (i) the communication by telemedicine meets the requirements of administrative rules  
33 adopted in accordance with Subsection (3); and

34 (ii) the health care services are eligible for reimbursement under the state's medical  
35 assistance program.

36 (b) This Subsection (1) applies to any managed care organization that contracts with  
37 the state's medical assistance program.

38 (2) The reimbursement rate for telemedicine services approved under this section:

39 (a) shall be subject to reimbursement policies set by the state plan; and

40 (b) may be based on:

41 (i) a monthly reimbursement rate;

42 (ii) a daily reimbursement rate; or

43 (iii) an encounter rate.

44 (3) The department shall adopt administrative rules in accordance with Title 63,  
45 Chapter 46a, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, which establish:

46 (a) the particular telemedicine services that are considered face to face encounters for  
47 reimbursement purposes under the state's medical assistance program; and

48 (b) the reimbursement methodology for the telemedicine services designated under  
49 Subsection (3)(a).
