State Impact

Enactment of this bill will change the eligibility requirement for a clean fuel special group license plate from the standards set forth for a clean special fuel tax certificate to standards established by the Department of Transportation. Approximately 1,000 owners will be required to buy new plates at \$5 per plate. Of the amount they pay, \$1 will be deposited into the Transportation Fund and \$4 into the Reflectorized Plate Fee dedicated credit account to cover the cost of replacement.
