LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies provisions relating to applied technology education, including merging the Salt Lake/Tooele Applied Technology College Campus with Salt Lake Community College.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ prohibits the State Board of Regents from conducting a feasibility study or performing another act relating to merging certain institutions with another institution of higher education;
- ▶ removes the Salt Lake/Tooele Applied Technology College Campus from the Utah College of Applied Technology and transfers its functions and responsibilities to Salt Lake Community College;
- ▶ creates a college advisory council at Salt Lake Community College and specifies its membership and duties;
- ▶ modifies applied technology education reporting provisions; and
- ▶ makes technical corrections.

44 Section 1. Section **53A-15-202** is amended to read:

45 **53A-15-202. Powers of the board.**

46 The State Board of Education:

47 (1) shall establish minimum standards for applied technology programs in the public
48 education system;

49 (2) may apply for, receive, administer, and distribute funds made available through
50 programs of federal and state governments to promote and aid applied technology education;

51 (3) shall cooperate with federal and state governments to administer programs which
52 promote and maintain applied technology education;

53 (4) shall cooperate with the Utah College of Applied Technology to ensure that
54 students in the public education system have access to applied technology education at Utah
55 College of Applied Technology campuses;

56 (5) shall require that before a minor student may participate in clinical experiences as

57 part of a health care occupation program at a high school or other institution to which the
58 student has been referred, the student's parent or legal guardian has:

59 (a) been first given written notice through appropriate disclosure when registering and
60 prior to participation that the program contains a clinical experience segment in which the
61 student will observe and perform specific health care procedures that may include personal
62 care, patient bathing, and bathroom assistance; and

75 **53B-1-103. Establishment of State Board of Regents -- Powers and authority.**

76 (1) There is established a State Board of Regents.

77 (2) (a) The board is vested with the control, management, and supervision of the
78 institutions of higher education designated in Section 53B-1-102 in a manner consistent with
79 the policy and purpose of this title and the specific powers and responsibilities granted to it.

80 (b) The board is vested with the following powers relating to the Utah College of
81 Applied Technology and its college campuses:

82 (i) approving each competency-based associate of applied technology degree before
83 allowing a college campus to offer the degree;

84 (ii) making rules governing the transfer of applied technology education degrees
85 awarded by the Utah College of Applied Technology to other higher education institutions;

86 (iii) appointing the president for the Utah College of Applied Technology in
87 accordance with Section 53B-2a-102 and board policy; and

88 (iv) facilitating and coordinating the operation of the Utah College of Applied
89 Technology within the system of higher education.

90 (c) Except for the Utah College of Applied Technology, the board may modify the
91 name of an institution under its control and management, as designated in Section 53B-1-102,
92 to reflect the role and general course of study of the institution.

93 (d) The board may not conduct a feasibility study or perform another act relating to
94 merging any of the following institutions with another institution of higher education:

95 (i) the Bridgerland Applied Technology College Campus;

96 (ii) the Ogden-Weber Applied Technology College Campus;

97 (iii) the Davis Applied Technology College Campus;

98 (iv) the Mountainland Applied Technology College Campus;

102 (3) The board is the State Postsecondary Review Entity for Utah for purposes of Title

106 Education to apply for, accept, and manage federal appropriations for the establishment and
107 maintenance of applied technology education.

111 Technology.

112 (b) The president of the Utah College of Applied Technology does not need to have a
113 doctorate degree, but shall have extensive experience in applied technology education.

114 (c) The president shall serve at the board's discretion.

115 (d) The names of the final candidates for president of the Utah College of Applied
116 Technology shall be publicly disclosed.

117 (e) The chair and vice chair of the Utah College of Applied Technology Board of
118 Trustees shall be members of the search committee for the president.

- 119 (2) The president shall:
- 120 (a) direct the Utah College of Applied Technology and coordinate the activities of each
121 of its college campuses;
- 122 (b) in cooperation with the board of trustees and with the approval of the board,

- 164 (1) There is created the Utah College of Applied Technology Board of Trustees,
- 165 composed of the following members:
 - 166 (a) two members of the State Board of Education appointed by the governor with the
 - 167 consent of the Senate;
 - 168 (b) two members of the State Board of Regents appointed by the governor with the
 - 169 consent of the Senate;
 - 170 (c) one member representing business and industry from the regional board of each
 - 171 regional applied technology college appointed by a majority vote of the business and industry
 - 172 members of the regional board;
 - 173 (d) one member representing business and industry from the Snow College applied

463 for immediate placement in the job market and serve the geographic area encompassing:

464 (i) the Salt Lake City School District;

465 (ii) the Granite School District;

466 (iii) the Jordan School District;

467 (iv) the Murray School District; and

468 (v) the Tooele School District.

469 (2) Salt Lake Community College may not exercise any jurisdiction over applied
470 technology education provided by a school district independently of Salt Lake Community
471 College.

472 (3) (a) An employee of the Salt Lake/Tooele Applied Technology College Campus
473 who is transferred to Salt Lake Community College because of the transfer of functions and
474 responsibilities between the institutions shall have the opportunity to continue employment in a
475 position that is similar to the employee's previous position.

476 (b) Salt Lake Community College shall, in good faith ensure that, during the transition
477 with the Salt Lake/Tooele Applied Technology College Campus, it:

478 (i) preserves employment positions;

479 (ii) retains qualified employees in positions that are similar to the employees' previous
480 positions; and

481 (iii) transfers employees to other positions on a voluntary basis, with retraining as
482 necessary.

483 (4) Salt Lake Community College shall report to the Utah College of Applied
484 Technology by September 30 of each year on the status of and maintenance of the effort for
485 applied technology education in the region served by Salt Lake Community College, including
486 access to open-entry, open-exit competency-based applied technology education programs at
487 the tuition rate approved by the Utah College of Applied Technology for adults and at no
488 tuition cost to secondary students.

489 Section 10. Section **53B-16-210** is enacted to read:

490 **53B-16-210. Salt Lake Community College -- College advisory council --**

491 **Membership -- Duties.**

492 (1) Salt Lake Community College shall have a college advisory council composed of
493 the following 15 members:

494 (a) the career and technical education director for the Salt Lake City School District;

495 (b) the career and technical education director for the Granite School District;

496 (c) the career and technical education director for the Jordan School District;

497 (d) the career and technical education director for the Murray School District;

498 (e) the career and technical education director for the Tooele School District;

499 (f) one member of the Salt Lake Community College board of trustees appointed by the
500 president of Salt Lake Community College;

501 (g) one member appointed by the executive director of the Department of Workforce
502 Services; and

503 (h) eight representatives of business or industry within the region appointed by the
504 president of Salt Lake Community College from members of the program advisory committees
505 overseeing career and technical education in the region.

506 (2) The college advisory council shall:

507 (a) consult with Salt Lake Community College and school districts within its region
508 and prepare a comprehensive strategic plan for delivering applied technology education within
509 its region;

510 (b) make recommendations regarding what skills are needed for employment in Utah
511 businesses and industries;

512 (c) recommend programs based upon the information gathered in accordance with
513 Subsection (2)(b);

514 (d) review annual program evaluations;

515 (e) provide counsel, support, and recommendations for updating and improving the
516 effectiveness of applied technology education programs and services, including expedited
517 program approval and termination procedures, consistent with Board of Regents' policy;

518 (f) monitor program advisory committees and other advisory groups to provide
519 counsel, support, and recommendations for updating and improving the effectiveness of
520 training programs and services; and

521 (g) coordinate with local school boards and districts to protect and enhance the applied

522 technology education needs of secondary students.

523 Section 11. **Effective date.**

524 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2008.
