	Section 1. Section 53A-11-102 is amended to read:
	53A-11-102. Minors exempt from school attendance.
	(1) (a) A school-age minor may be excused from attendance by the local board of
e	education and a parent exempted from application of Subsections 53A-11-101.5(2), (5), and (6)

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28	for any of the following reasons:
29	(i) a minor over age 16 may receive a partial release from school to enter employment,
30	or attend a trade school, if the minor has completed the eighth grade; or
31	(ii) on an annual basis, a minor may receive a full release from attending a public,
32	regularly established private, or part-time school or class if:
33	(A) the minor has already completed the work required for graduation from high
34	school, or has demonstrated mastery of required skills and competencies in accordance with
