State Impact

Enactment of this bill will require an appropriation of \$264,000 in FY 2009 from the Federal Unemployment Insurance Administrative Grant and the Commerce Service Fund to build the database. In FY 2010 the bill will require an appropriation of \$114,000 from the Federal Unemployment Insurance Administrative Grant and the Commerce Service Fund to fund database maintenance. This would also result in a reduction in General Fund revenue of \$250,000 in FY 2009 and \$100,000 in FY 2010.
