(1) A highway is dedicated and abandoned to the use of the public when it has been 30 31 continuously used as a public thoroughfare for a period of ten years. 32 (2) The dedication and abandonment creates a right-of-way held by the state in accordance with Sections 72-3-102, 72-3-104, 72-3-105, and 72-5-103. 33 34 (3) The scope of the right-of-way is that which is reasonable and necessary to ensure 35 safe travel according to the facts and circumstances. 36 (4) An action to establish a highway as public under this section must be brought 37 within ten years of the last use by the public. (5) (a) If there is an interruption in the continuous use of a highway as a public 38 39 thoroughfare, the ten year continuous use period under Subsection (1) shall restart following the interruption in the use of the highway as a public thoroughfare. 40 41 (b) An interruption under Subsection (5)(a) may include: (i) the property owner controlling access to the highway through closed gates; or 42 (ii) the property owner expelling a person who lacked permission to use the highway. 43
