 urges continued support for and participation in Utah's Legislators Back to School
Program during the 2008-09 school year.

28 trust and confidence; 29 WHEREAS, Utah legislators acknowledge the Constitution of the United States as the 30 supreme law of the land, which establishes a republican form of government and provides the 31 principle for self-government, government by the people through the democratic process; 32 WHEREAS, Benjamin Rush, a signer of the Declaration of Independence stated, 33 "There is but one method of rendering a republican form of government... by disseminating 34 the seeds of virtue and knowledge through every part of the state by means of proper places and 35 modes of education . . . and this can be done effectively only by the aid of the legislature"; 36 WHEREAS, Utah legislators, students, teachers, and administrators realize the 37 importance of compromise in reconciling competing interests in a diverse society; 38 WHEREAS, the National Conference of State Legislatures established America's 39 Legislators Back to School Program, a bipartisan program for legislators across the nation to 40 impart greater understanding of the necessity for debate, negotiation, and compromise in the 41 legislative process of developing effective public policy, to engage future voters and leaders in 42 a dialogue about the value of representative democracy, and to adapt the program to each 43 individual state; 44 WHEREAS, this civic education program helps to instill the values of representative 45 democracy, strengthen the democratic process, and encourage students to play a responsible 46 role in their government; and 47 WHEREAS, Utah legislators ranked second in the nation for participation in this 48 program during the 2006-07 school year and have ranked in the top three since the program's 49 inception: 50 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, the 51 Governor concurring therein, emphasize and urge support of civic education to promote greater 52 understanding of government and the role of legislators in representative democracy. 53 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and the Governor recognize Utah's 54 Legislators Back to School Program and urge each member of the Legislature to visit students 55 in classrooms during the school year. 56 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the State Board 57 of Education and the executive director of the National Conference of State Legislatures.
