The Health and Human Services Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 101**, AMENDMENTS TO EMERGENCY INJECTION FOR ANAPHYLACTIC REACTION ACT, by Representative T. Kiser, with the following amendments:

 - school may not prohibit or dissuade a teacher <u>or other school employee</u> from receiving training to administer,

 - epinephrine auto-injector available to any teacher <u>or other school employee who</u>
