## Mr. Speaker:

The Judiciary Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 149**, PROTECTIVE ORDER AMENDMENTS, by Representative L. Fowlke, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 3, Lines 61 through 62:
  - 61 (g) order the appointment of represent the interests of any
  - 62 minor children of the parties , if abuse or neglect of the minor children is alleged, or appoint a private Guardian ad Litem, if appropriate, pursuant to Section 78A-2-228 :
- 2. Page 5, Lines 145 through 150:
  - (b) If at that hearing the court does not issue a protective order, the ex parte protective
  - order shall expire, unless it is otherwise extended by the court. Extensions beyond the 20-day
  - period may not be granted unless the <u>respondent</u> <u>petitioner is unable to be</u> <u>present at the hearing, or</u> :
  - 148 (i) the respondent has not been served;
  - 149 (ii) the respondent has had the opportunity to present a defense at the hearing; {or}
  - 150 (iii) the respondent requests that the exparte order be extended ; or (iv) exigent circumstances exist .
- 3. Page 7, Lines 185 through 186:
  - 185 (2) Notice of a motion to dismiss a protective order shall be by personal service on the petitioner in a the petitioner in a
  - protective order action { in accordance with the } as provided in Rules 4 and 5,
    Utah Rules of Civil Procedure.
