## S.B. 27 Trustees Sale - Process for Excess Proceeds (Sen. G. Davis)

Rep. Garn introduced the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Neuenschwander moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed

unanimously, with Rep. Ferry, Rep. Morley, and Rep. Walker absent for the vote.

### S.B. 30 Consumer Sales Practice Act Amendments (Sen. P. Jones)

Sen. Jones introduced the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Biskupski moved to amend the bill as follows:

The motion to amend passed unanimously, with Rep. Froerer and Rep. Morley absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Kiser moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously.

## H.B. 290 Municipal Oversight of Rental Dwellings (Rep. G. Froerer)

Rep. Froerer introduced the bill to the committee with the assistance of Paul Smith, Utah Apartment Association.

MOTION: Rep. Froerer moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 21 through 22:
  - 21 { regulating the practice of submetering, ratio utility billing, or other utility cost
  - 22 allocation method;
- 2. *Page 1, Lines 25 through 27:* 
  - 25 dwelling was constructed, { other than a smoke detector; or } except as required under the Utah Uniform Building Standards Act; and
  - 26 { imposing a civil or criminal penalty on the owner of a rental dwelling for a
  - 27 safety device controlled by a tenant; and }
- 3. *Page 3, Lines 85 through 88:*

- 85 <u>dwelling</u>; <u>or</u>
- 86 { (b) regulate the practice of submetering, ratio utility billing, or other utility cost
- 87 allocation method;
- 88 (c) (b) except as required under Title 58, Chapter 56, Utah Uniform

  Building Standards Act, require the owner of a rental dwelling to retrofit the rental dwelling with or install
- 4. Page, Line 90 through Page 4, Line 92:
  - 90 <u>constructed</u> { , other than a smoke detector; or }
  - 91 { (d) impose a civil or criminal penalty on an owner of a rental dwelling for a safety
  - 92 <u>device controlled by a tenant of the rental dwelling.</u>}

The motion to amend passed unanimously, with Rep. Kiser absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Dunnigan moved to amend the bill as follows:

- Page 1 Delete lines 15 and 16
- Page 3 Reinstate the language on line 65, and renumber accordingly
- Page 3 Reinstate the language on lines 81-82, and renumber accordingly

The motion to amend failed, with Rep. Dunnigan and Rep. Morley voting in favor. Rep. Garn and Rep. Hansen were absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Biskupski moved to pass the bill out favorably as amended. The motion passed, with Rep. Dunnigan voting in opposition. Rep. Garn and Rep. Hansen were absent for the vote.

Chair S. Clark relinquished the chair to Vice Chair Dunnigan.

## H.C.R. 3 Concurrent Resolution - Declaring Love Your Library Week (Rep. S. Clark)

Rep. S. Clark introduced the resolution to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Biskupski moved to amend the bill as follows:

unanimously, with Rep. Garn and Rep. Hansen absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Biskupski moved to place the resolution on the Consent Calendar. The

motion passed unanimously, with Rep. Garn and Rep. Hansen absent for the vote.

H.B. 128 Utah Residential Mortgage Practices Act Amendments (Rep. M. Newbold)

This bill was not heard.

with Rep. Garn and Rep. Hansen absent for the vote.
