#### 1st Sub. S.B. 70 Emotional Support Animals (Sen. S. McCoy)

Sen. McCoy explained 1st Substitute S.B. 70 to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Menlove moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 6, Lines 152 through 155:

# { <u>(b) This section does not prohibit an owner or lessor of housing accommodations</u> <u>from</u>

- 153 <u>charging a person, including a person with a disability, a reasonable deposit as</u> security for any
- 154 <u>damage or wear and tear that might be caused by an emotional support animal if the</u> owner or
- 155 <u>lessor would charge a similar deposit to other persons for potential wear and tear.</u>}

The motion to amend the bill passed unanimously.

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MOTION: Rep. Harper moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 5, Lines 129 through 131:
  - 129 (1) A mental health therapist may provide a person with a disability with
  - 130 documentation that:
  - 131 (a) is signed by the mental health therapist as defined in Section 58-60-102 ;

The motion to amend the bill passed unanimously.

MOTION: Rep. Riesen moved to pass the bill as amended with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed unanimously.
