H.B. 156 Dna Sample - Felony and Certain Misdemeanor Arrests (*Rep. K. Gibson*)

Rep. Gibson was commended for the tribute paid on the House floor to families of fallen soldiers.

MOTION: Rep. Dee moved to replace H.B. 156 with **1st Substitute H.B. 156.** The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Lockhart, Rep. Oda, Rep. Ray, Rep. Wiley, and Rep. Wimmer absent for the vote.

Rep. Gibson presented the bill.

Spoke in favor of the bill: Mr. Jay Henry, State Crime Laboratory Lt. Lee Perry, Utah Highway Patrol, speaking for the Perry family

MOTION: Rep. Litvack moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Oda absent for the vote.

H.B. 315 Child and Vulnerable Adult Endangerment Provisions (*Rep. M. Morley*)

Rep. Morley presented the bill with the assistance of Ms. Jaycee Skinner, Statewide Association of Prosecutors.

MOTION: Rep. Morley moved to amend the bill as follows:
