H.B. 295 Public School Electronic Device Policies (*Rep. S. Allen*)

Rep. Allen presented the bill.

- 17 {-allows } <u>requires</u> the State Board of Education to make rules that provide:

H.B. 341 Damage to Underground Utility Facilities Amendments (Rep. D. Clark)

Rep. D. Clark presented the bill. (handout)

MOTION: Rep. Hunsaker moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 3, Lines 64 through 65:
 - 64 [(2)] (3) "Emergency" means an occurrence <u>or suspected natural gas leak</u> necessitating immediate action to prevent
 - 65 or mitigate loss of, or damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services.
- 2. Page 5, Lines 140 through 145:
 - 140 (b) The requirements of Subsection (1)(a) do not apply:
 - 141 (i) if there is an emergency;
 - 142 (ii) while gardening; $\{+\}$ or $\{+\}$
 - 143 (iii) while tilling private ground $\{+\}$. $\{+\}$
 - 144 <u>(iv) while probing with an industry-approved probe bar to determine the</u> presence or
 - 145 <u>extent of a natural gas leak in the ground.</u>}
- 3. Page 6, Line 155:
 - 155 (i) location _, with reasonable specificity ;

- 4. Page 7, Line 204:
 - 204 (ii) notify the excavator, by telephonic <u>or electronic</u> message or indication at the <u>excavation site</u>, that
- 5. Page 9, Line 266:
 - 266 (b) An operator may waive <u>, in writing or electronically</u>, the requirement that the excavator determine the exact
- 6. Page 10, Lines 286 through 289:
 - (b) An excavator is [not] liable for damage { to an underground facility } incurred by an operator if [an operator
 - 287 has failed to comply with Section 54-8a-5 or 54-8a-9.]:
 - 288 (i) the operator complies with Section 54-8a-5; and
 - 289 (ii) the damage occurs within 24 inches of the operator's markings.
- 7. Page 10, Lines 297 through 298:
 - 297 (b) immediately call 911 if the excavation { results } may result in { the escape of a flammable gas or
 - 298 <u>toxic or corrosive gas or liquid, or damages an electrical line</u>} <u>an immediate risk</u> <u>to human life</u>.
- 8. Page 11, Lines 311 through 321:
 - 311 (3) Notwithstanding Subsection (2)(a) a penalty under this chapter may not be
 - 312 <u>imposed</u> {
 - 313 <u>(a)</u> on an excavator <u>or operator</u> unless the excavator <u>or operator</u> fails to comply with this chapter and damages
 - 314 <u>an underground facility</u> {; or
 - 315 <u>(b) on an operator unless:</u>
 - 316 <u>(i) (A) the operator fails to respond to a location request under Section 54-8a-5</u> in order
 - 317 <u>to prevent damage to the facility; or</u>
 - 318 <u>(B) the operator fails to take reasonable steps, in response to a location request,</u> <u>to</u>
 - 319 ensure accurate marking of the facility in order to prevent damage to the facility; and
 - 320 <u>(ii) damage occurs to an underground facility as a result of the operator's failure</u> <u>under</u>

321 <u>Subsection (3)(b)(i)(A) or (B)</u>} .
