Section 1. Section 26-7-4 is enacted to read:

26-7-4. Public education and outreach regarding substances harmful during pregnancy.

The department shall, under the direction of the Utah Substance Abuse and Anti-violence Coordinating Council, created in Section 63-25a-203, and in consultation with the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health, within the Department of Human Services, conduct a public education and outreach program to inform pregnant women and women who may become pregnant of:

(1) the danger of using alcohol, tobacco, or other harmful substances during pregnancy;

(2) treatment and other assistance available to help women avoid or stop the use or abuse of a substance described in Subsection (1); and

(3) legal protections provided by law or court rule that prohibit information relating to treatment received under Subsection (2) from being used as evidence against the woman in court.
