HOME SCHOOL AND EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AMENDMENTS

Senator Mark B. Madsen proposes the following amendments:

1. Page 5, Lines 139 through 144:

139 (e) (i) ~~{Private}~~ Except as provided in Subsections (7)(f) through (h):
(A) private school students and home school students shall be eligible for
140 extracurricular activities at a public school consistent with eligibility standards as applied to
141 fully enrolled public school students ~~{, except as provided in Subsections (7)(f) through (h)}~~ ; and
(B) a public school student who has been declared to be ineligible to participate in an
extracurricular activity and who subsequently enrolls in a home school may not regain eligibility until the
student resolves the reason for ineligibility and conforms to the eligibility standards applicable to fully
enrolled public school students.

142 (ii) ~~{a}~~ A school district or public school may not impose additional requirements on
143 private school students or home school students to participate in extracurricular activities that
144 are not imposed on fully enrolled public school students.
