(1) The county legislative body of a county that receives revenues from the following
may deposit up to $\hat{H} \rightarrow [\underline{\text{the entire amount}}] \underline{30\%} \leftarrow \hat{H}$ of the revenues the county receives into a
conservation and
preservation fund as provided in this section:
(a) a rollback tax under:
(i) Section 59-2-506; or
(ii) Section 59-2-511;
(b) a conservation easement rollback tax under Section 59-2-506.5;
(c) an in lieu fee payment under:
(i) Section 59-2-506.5; or
(ii) Section 59-2-511; or
(d) interest on a rollback tax, conservation easement rollback tax, or in lieu fee
payment described in Subsections (1)(a) through (c).
(2) A county legislative body may expend revenues described in Subsection (1) that the
county legislative body deposits into a conservation and preservation fund for the conservation
and preservation of:
(a) agricultural land;
(b) critical watershed land;
(c) critical wildlife habitat;
(d) open space;
(e) a park;
(f) a trail; or
(g) a combination of Subsections (2)(a) through (f) as determined by the county
legislative body.
(3) A conservation and preservation fund established under this section is subject to
Title 17, Chapter 36, Uniform Fiscal Procedures Act for Counties.
