12	General Description:
13	This bill amends the Health Care Facility Licensing and Inspection Act by providing
14	measures to discourage identity theft and health insurance fraud, and to protect the
15	accuracy of medical records.
16	Highlighted Provisions:
17	This bill:
18	 defines terms;
19	 requires a medical facility or a health professional office to, prior to providing
20	services to a patient, request identification for:
21	• the patient; and
22	• an individual who consents to the provision of services to the patient, if the
23	patient lacks the capacity to consent;
24	 permits a medical facility or a health professional office to use certain methods to
25	document or confirm a patient's identity;
26	 prohibits a medical facility or a health professional office that is subject to the
27	federal Emergency Medical Treatment and Active Labor Act (EMTALA) from
28	denying services to an individual on the basis that the individual does not provide

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29 identification when requested;

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30	 provides that a medical facility or a health professional office is not subject to a
31	private right of action for failing to ask for identification; and
32	 prohibits the imposition of penalties if a medical facility or a health professional
33	office does not request documentation.

68	professional office shall request identification from an individual prior to providing in-patient
69	or out-patient services to the individual.
70	(b) If the individual who will receive services from the medical facility or a health
71	professional office lacks the legal capacity to consent to treatment, the medical facility or a
72	health professional office shall request identification:
73	(i) for the individual who lacks the legal capacity to consent to treatment; and
74	(ii) from the individual who consents to treatment on behalf of the individual
75	described in Subsection (2)(b)(i).
76	(3) A medical facility or a health professional office:
