maintain an ethics training course for members of the Legislature and lobbyists;
<ul> <li>requires that training materials and exercises be available on the Internet to</li> </ul>
legislators, lobbyists, and to the public;
<ul> <li>provides that the course be designed to assist legislators and lobbyists in</li> </ul>
understanding and complying with current ethical and campaign finance
requirements;
requires that provisions be included to verify when a legislator or lobbyist has
successfully completed training exercises; and
<ul> <li>requires that legislators and lobbyists complete the course annually or as directed</li> </ul>
by the Legislative Management Committee.

36	(1) The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel shall develop and
37	maintain an ethics training course for members of the Legislature and lobbyists.
38	(2) The ethics training course shall include training materials and exercises that are
39	available on the Internet to legislators, lobbyists, and to the public.
40	(3) The ethics training course shall be designed to assist legislators and lobbyists in
41	understanding and complying with current ethical and campaign finance requirements under
42	state law, legislative rules, and federal law.
43	(4) The ethics training course shall include provisions for verifying when a legislator
44	or lobbyist has successfully completed key training exercises.
45	(5) A legislator or lobbyist shall successfully complete the key training exercises of the
46	ethics training course once each year or as directed by the Legislative Management
47	Committee.
48	(6) A lobbyist who does not complete the training required by this rule is subject to an
49	ethics complaint under Senate or House rule.
