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41	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
42	Section 1. Section <b>64-13e-102</b> is amended to read:
43	64-13e-102. Definitions.
44	As used in this chapter:
45	(1) "Actual state daily incarceration rate" means the daily incarceration rate that reflects
46	the actual expenses of the department, including:
47	(a) executive overhead;
48	(b) administrative overhead;
49	(c) transportation overhead;
50	(d) division overhead;
51	(e) motor pool expenses;
52	(f) medical expenses;
53	(g) mental health expenses;
54	(h) dental expenses; and
55	(i) straight line capital depreciation, over a 40-year period, for prison facilities of the
56	department.

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57	(2) "CCJJ" means the Utah Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice, created in
58	Section 67M-7-201.
59	[(2)] (3) "Department" means the Department of Corrections.
60	(4) "Division of Finance" means the Division of Finance, created in Section
61	<u>63A-3-101.</u>
62	[(3)] (5) "Final state daily incarceration rate" means the average actual state daily
63	incarceration rate, <u>calculated</u> , reviewed, and discussed under [Subsection] <u>Section</u>
64	64-13e-105[ <del>(2)</del> ], and approved by the Legislature under Subsection 64-13e-105(3).
65	[(4)] (6) "State inmate" means a person, other than a state probationary inmate or state
66	parole inmate, who is committed to the custody of the department.
67	$[\frac{(5)}{(7)}]$ "State parole inmate" means a person who is:
68	(a) on parole, as defined in Section 77-27-1; and
69	(b) housed in a county jail for a reason related to the person's parole[:], including a
70	person who is:
71	(i) detained for an alleged parole violation;
72	(ii) detained for the purpose of revoking parole;
73	(iii) detained because the person's parole is revoked; or
74	(iv) initially detained upon placement on parole.
75	[(6)] (8) "State probationary inmate" means felony probationers sentenced to time in a
76	county jail under Subsection 77-18-1(8).
77	Section 2. Section <b>64-13e-104</b> is amended to read:
78	64-13e-104. Housing of state probationary inmates or state parole inmates
79	Payment.
80	(1) (a) A county shall accept and house a state probationary inmate or a state parole
81	inmate in a county correctional facility, subject to available resources.
82	(b) If a county is unable to accept a person due to lack of resources, the county shall
83	negotiate with another county to accept and house the person.
84	(2) Within funds appropriated by the Legislature for this purpose, the [department]
85	<u>Division of Finance</u> shall [reimburse] pay a county that houses a state probationary inmate or a
86	state parole inmate at a rate of $[42.1\%]$ 50% of the final state daily incarceration rate.
87	(3) Funds appropriated by the Legislature under Subsection (2):

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88	(a) are nonlapsing;
89	(b) may only be used for the purposes described in Subsection (2); and
90	(c) may not be used for:
91	(i) the costs of administering the [reimbursement] payment described in this section; or
92	(ii) payment of contract costs under Section 64-13e-103.
93	(4) The costs described in Subsection (3)(c)(i) shall be covered by legislative
94	appropriation.
95	(5) (a) The [director of the department] Division of Finance shall administer the
96	[reimbursement] payment described in [this section] Subsection (2).
97	(b) [The department] In accordance with Subsections (8) and (9), CCJJ shall, by rule
98	made pursuant to Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, establish
99	procedures for the [distribution of reimbursement] calculation of the payment described in [this
100	section Subsection (2).
101	(6) Counties that receive the [reimbursement] payment described in [this section]
102	Subsection (2) shall, on [or before July 31 of each year] at least a monthly basis, submit a
103	report to [the department, for the preceding fiscal year,] CCJJ that includes:
104	(a) the number of state probationary inmates and state parole inmates the county
105	housed under this section; and
106	(b) the total number of state probationary inmate days of incarceration and state parole
107	inmate days of incarceration that were provided by the county.
108	(7) (a) On or before September 1 of each year, CCJJ shall compile the information
109	from the reports described in Subsection (6) and provide a copy of the compilation to each
110	county that submitted a report.
111	(b) On or before September 30 of each year, CCJJ shall inform the Division of Finance
112	and each county of the exact amount of the payment described in this section that shall be made
113	to each county.
114	(8) On or before December 15 of each year, the Division of Finance shall distribute the
115	payment described in Subsection (7)(b) in a single payment to each county.
116	(9) The amount paid to each county under Subsection (8) shall be calculated on a pro
117	rata basis, based on the number of state probationary inmate days of incarceration and state

parole inmate days of incarceration that were provided by each county for the state fiscal year

119	described in Subsection (6).
120	Section 3. Section <b>64-13e-105</b> is amended to read:
121	64-13e-105. Procedures for setting the final state daily incarceration rate.
122	(1) (a) Before September 1 of each year, the department shall calculate, and inform the
123	counties and CCJJ of[7] the average actual state daily incarceration rate for the most recent
124	three years for which the data is available.
125	(b) The actual state daily incarceration rates used to calculate the average rate
126	described in Subsection (1)(a) may not be less than the rates presented to the Executive
127	Appropriations Committee of the Legislature for purposes of setting the appropriation for the
128	department's budget.
129	(2) Before [October 1] September 15 of each year, the following parties shall meet to
130	review and discuss the average actual state daily incarceration rate, described in Subsection (1)
131	and the compilation described in Subsection 64-13e-104(7):
132	(a) as designated by the Utah Sheriffs Association:
133	(i) one sheriff of a county that is currently under contract with the department to house
134	state inmates; and
135	(ii) one sheriff of a county that is currently receiving reimbursement from the
136	department for housing state probationary inmates or state parole inmates;
137	(b) the executive director of the department or the executive director's designee;
138	(c) as designated by the Utah Association of Counties:
139	(i) one member of the legislative body of one county that is currently under contract
140	with the department to house state inmates; and
141	(ii) one member of the legislative body of one county that is currently receiving
142	reimbursement from the department for housing state probationary inmates or state parole
143	inmates;
144	(d) the executive director of the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice or the
145	executive director's designee; and
146	(e) the director of the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget or the director's
147	designee.
148	(3) (a) The average actual state daily incarceration rate, reviewed and discussed under
149	Subsection (2), may not be used for purposes of calculating payment or reimbursement under

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- this chapter, unless approved by the Legislature in the annual appropriations act.
- 151 (b) Nothing in this chapter prohibits the Legislature from setting the final state daily 152 incarceration rate at an amount higher or lower than:
  - (i) the average actual state incarceration rate; or
- (ii) the final state daily incarceration rate that was used during the preceding fiscal year.
