State Impact

This Legislation requires a one-time appropriation of \$5,000 General Fund and \$5,000 Federal Funds (\$10,000 total) in FY 2009 to the Department of Workforce Services and \$45,600 General Fund and \$170,000 Federal Funds (\$215,600 total) to the Department of Health. Additionally, this Legislation requires an ongoing appropriation beginning in FY 2010 of \$26,500 General Fund and \$48,800 Federal Funds (\$75,300 total) to the Department of Workforce Services for 1.25 FTEs. Also this Legislation requires an ongoing appropriation beginning in FY 2010 of \$365,100 General Fund and \$1,359,900 Federal Funds (\$1,725,000 total) to the Department of Health. Medicaid's emergency medical spending may be reduced.
