LONG TITLE

7 **General Description:**

8 This bill provides that the tolling statute does not apply if jurisdiction can be obtained
9 using the long arm statute.

- 12 ▶ exempts the provisions of the long arm jurisdiction statute from the tolling statute.

19 **78B-2-104**, as renumbered and amended by Laws of Utah 2008, Chapter 3

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

21 Section 1. Section **78B-2-104** is amended to read:

22 **78B-2-104. Effect of absence from state.**

23 If a cause of action accrues against a person while the person is out of the state and the
24 person is not subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of this state in accordance with Section
25 78B-3-205, the action may be commenced within the term as limited by this chapter after his



28 return to the state. If after a cause of action accrues the person departs from the state, the time
29 of his absence is not part of the time limited for the commencement of the action unless
30 Section 78B-3-205 applies.
