The Judiciary Committee recommends **H.B. 148**, VICTIM RIGHTS AMENDMENTS, by Representative R. C. Webb, be replaced and reports a favorable recommendation on **2nd Sub.** 

- **H.B. 148**, VICTIM RIGHTS AMENDMENTS with the following amendments:
  - 1. Page 6, Line 166:
    - 166 <u>occurred more than</u> { <u>one year</u>} <u>six months</u> <u>before the victim filed an action</u> alleging the violation of the right.
  - 2. Page 6, Lines 177 through 178:
    - 177 (2) This chapter may not be construed as creating a basis for defendant [dismissing] {-a
    - 178 <u>to dismiss</u>} any criminal charge or delinquency petition, vacating any adjudication or conviction.
  - 3. Page 7, Lines 193 through 198:
    - 193 or retained by victims of crimes. {-
    - 194 Section 5. Effective date.
    - 195 <u>If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes</u>

      <u>effect</u>
    - 196 <u>upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of</u>
      <u>Utah</u>
    - 197 <u>Constitution Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,</u>
    - 198 the date of veto override.
