Rep. Painter called the meeting to order at 7:35 a.m.

MOTION: Rep. Wallis moved to approve the minutes of the February 27, 2009 meeting. The motion passed unanimously, with Rep. Clark, Rep. Duckworth, Rep. Froerer, Rep. King, Rep. Kiser, and Rep. Morley absent for the vote.

H.B. 111 Deferred Deposit Lending Amendments (*Rep. L. Black*)

Rep. Black presented the bill to the committee with the assistance of Christopher Peterson, professor, University of Utah School of Law. (handout)

MOTION: Rep. Dunnigan moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 2, Line 58 through Page 3, Line 66:

58 (9) "Interest or fees" { includes the cost elements associated with the extension
of credit;
59 including;
60 —(a) a fee;

- 61 ~~— (b) a charge, such as:~~
62 ~~— (i) a service charge; or~~
63 ~~— (ii) a renewal charge;~~

has the same meaning as "finance charge" is defined in 15 U.S.C. 1605, and as implemented by regulations of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System.

H.B. 404 Disclosure of Real Property (Rep. M. Newbold)

Rep. Newbold presented the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Dunnigan moved to adopt 1st Substitute H.B. 404. The motion passed unanimously, with Rep. Clark absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Biskupski moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed, with Rep. Dunnigan, Rep. Kiser, Rep. Morley, and Rep. Painter voting in opposition. Rep. Clark was absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Duckworth moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously, with Rep. Clark absent for the vote.
