## H.B. 281 Wireless Communication Device Use Limitations While Operating a Motor Vehicle (*Rep. P. Ray*)

  - 40 operating a **moving** motor vehicle -- Exceptions -- Penalty.
- 5. Page 2, Line 52:
  - moving motor vehicle on a highway in this state.
- 6. Page 2, Line 54:
  - 54 <u>communication device while operating a</u> <u>moving</u> <u>motor vehicle within a reduced</u> speed school zone as
- 7. Page 3, Line 80:
  - 80 while operating a moving motor vehicle upon a highway of this state.
