MOTION: Rep. Wiley moved to approve the minutes of the February 24, 2009 meeting. The

H.B. 64 Deterring Illegal Immigration (Rep. B. Dee)

Rep. Dee reviewed the bill which was presented in the February 24, 2009 meeting with the assistance of Mr. Mark Shurtleff, Attorney General.

MOTION: Rep. Wimmer moved to adopt 1st Substitute H.B. 64.

MOTION: Rep. Dougall moved to adopt 1st Substitute H.B. 64 and amend the bill as

follows:

1. Page 1, Lines 10 through 11:

- operation of a multi-agency strike force to combat violent and other major <u>felony</u> crimes
- within the state associated with illegal immigration and human trafficking.

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- 2. *Page 1, Lines 15 through 16:*
 - operations of a multi-agency strike force to deal with major felony crimes committed
 - within the state related to illegal immigration and human trafficking;
- *3. Page 1, Lines 21 through 22:*
 - deterring, and eradicating violent and other major <u>felony</u> criminal activity within the state
 - related to illegal immigration and human trafficking;
- *4. Page 2, Lines 39 through 40:*
 - 39 <u>67-5-22.7.</u> Multi-agency strike force to combat violent and other major <u>felony</u> crimes
 - 40 associated with illegal immigration and human trafficking -- Fraudulent Documents
- 5. Page 2, Line 43:
 - 43 <u>operation of a multi-agency strike force to combat violent and other major felony</u> <u>crimes committed</u>
- 6. Page 2, Line 50:
 - 50 <u>eradicating violent and other major</u> <u>felony</u> <u>criminal activity related to illegal</u> <u>immigration and human</u>
