H.B. 112 Vehicle Towing Amendments (Rep. T. Kiser)

H.B. 261 Aviation Amendments (Rep. W. Harper)

Rep. Harper introduced the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Harper moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 13 through 16:
 - reduces the aviation fuel tax rate that a federally certificated air carrier pays on
 - aviation fuel purchased at an international airport located within a county of the first
 - class that has a United States customs office on its premises from \$.04 to \{\frac{\\$.026}\}{\} \quad \frac{\\$.025}{\} \quad on
 - each gallon of aviation fuel;
- 2. Page 1, Lines 24 through 25:
 - provides that <u>until July 1, 2014</u> the Department of Transportation may <u>not</u> use funds in the Aeronautics
 - 25 Restricted Account to purchase and operate aircraft for statewide aviation purposes;
- 3. Page 2, Lines 55 through 57:
 - (b) {2.6} cents per gallon on aviation fuel purchased at an international airport:
 - (i) located within a county of the first class; and
 - 57 (ii) that has a United States customs office on its premises.
- 4. *Page 4, Lines 93 through 100:*
 - 93 (b) Tax, [less a refund or credit]
 - 94 [claimed under Section 59-13-404,]
 - 95 on Each Gallon of Aviation
 - 96 Fuel Purchased for Use by a Certificated
 - 97 Air Carrier at [the Salt Lake International]
 - 98 [Airport] an International Airport Located Within
 - a County of the First Class that has a United
 - 100 States Customs Office on its Premises $\{+\}$ \$.025 $\{+\}$ $\{-\$.026\}$

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- 5. Page 6, Line 165:
 - 165 (c) { the purchase and operation of aircraft by the department for statewide purposes } operation of the division of aeronautics ;
- 6. Page 6, Line 169:
 - the duty of regulating and supervising aeronautics in this state.

(5) Until July 1, 2014, monies in the account may not be used by the department for the purchase or operation of aircraft for statewide purposes.
