### **Approval of Minutes**

**MOTION:** Sen. VanTassell moved that the minutes of February 27<sup>th</sup>, 2009 be approved.

The motion passed unanimously, with Sens. Urquhart, Davis and Mayne absent at the time of the vote.

# 1. SB0270 Gift Card Amendments

**MOTION:** Sen. Niederhauser moved to adopt 1<sup>st</sup> Substitute SB0270.

The motion passed unanimously, with Sens. Urquhart, Davis and Mayne absent at the time of the vote.

Sen. Niederhauser introduced and explained SB0270.

MOTION: Sen. Niederhauser moved to amend SB0270 as follows:

- 1. Page 7, Lines 199 through 201:
  - 199 (b) a gift card that:
  - 200 (i) has attached to {it} more than \$25 {when purchased}; and
  - 201 (ii) is not excluded from this chapter under Subsection (5); or
- 2. Page 8, Lines 214 through 215:
  - 214 (b) [the records of the issuer] do not show the address of the purchaser or recipient, but
  - 215 do show that the <u>gift certificate</u>  $\{\frac{1}{2}, \frac{1}{2}, \frac{1}{2}\}$  or <u>credit</u> memo was issued in Utah;
- 3. Page 8, Lines 224 through 228:
  - 224 (5) This chapter does not apply to a gift card if the monies attached to the gift card:
  - (a) do not expire; and
  - 226 (b) are not subject to a {<u>post-sale</u>} <u>monthly post sale</u> :
  - 227 (i) {monthly} maintenance fee or charge; or
  - 228 (ii) dormancy fee or charge.

The motion to amend passed unanimously with Sens. Urquhart, Davis, and Mayne absent for the vote.

Jim Olsen, Doug Foxley, and Shelly Cordon spoke in favor of SB0270.

Richard Ellis spoke to the bill.

Sen. Valentine relinquished the Chair to Sen. Urquhart.

**MOTION:** Sen. Liljenquist moved to pass 1<sup>st</sup> Substitute SB0270 out of committee with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously, with Sens. Valentine, Davis and Mayne absent at the time of the vote.

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## 2. <u>SB0166 Alcoholic Beverage Control Act - Days of Sale</u>

  - 297 financing entity, a related provider trust, or a special purpose entity from executing] the execution:
  - 297a (A) of  $\leftarrow \hat{H}$  any of the
  - 298 following with respect to the death benefit or ownership of any portion of a [viaticated] settled
  - 299 policy as provided for in Section 31A-36-109:
  - 300 [(i)]  $\hat{H} \rightarrow [(A)] (I) \leftarrow \hat{H}$  an assignment;
  - 301 [(ii)]  $\hat{H} \rightarrow [(\underline{B})] (\underline{II}) \leftarrow \hat{H}$  a sale;

  - 304a (B) by any of the following:
  - 304b (I) a life settlement provider;
  - 304c (II) a life settlement purchaser;
  - 304d (III) a financing entity;
  - 304e (IV) a related provider trust;
  - $304f \qquad (V) a special purpose entity; \{ \_or \}$
  - 304g (VI) a qualified institutional buyer as defined in Rule 144A, 17 C.F.R.

# 8. HB0152 Appraisal Management Company Regulation

- 1. Page 14, Line 423 through Page 15, Line 434:
  - 423 (1) An appraisal management company required to be registered under this chapter, or a
  - 424 controlling person, employee, or agent of the appraisal management company may not
  - 425 <u>influence or attempt to influence the development, reporting, or review of an appraisal</u> <u>through:</u>

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426	(a) coercion;	
427	(b) extortion;	
428	(c) collusion;	
429	(d) compensation;	
430	(e) instruction;	
431	(f) inducement;	
432	(g) intimidation;	
433	(h) bribery; or	
434	(i) any other manner	that would constitute undue influence .

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Urquhart absent at the time of the vote.

**MOTION:** Sen. Niederhauser moved to pass HB0152 as amended out of committee with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously.
