2. SB0223 City and County Carbon Credits for Sequestration of Waste Stream Material (R. Romero)

2. *Page 4, Lines 91 through 93:*

- 91 (6) A county providing waste and garbage collection and disposal services that
- 92 converts material to charcoal or biochar and sequesters the charcoal or biochar as
