 - 323 (iii) having an unladen dry weight of 2,200 pounds or less;
 - 324 (iv) having a seat height of {-30-} <u>25</u> to 40 inches when measured at the forward edge of the
 - 325 <u>seat bottom; and</u>

374	(d) one or more red reflectors on the rear;

390	(i) do not exceed 26 inches in height;
391	(ii) are not larger than the tires that the all-terrain vehicle manufacturer made

393	(iii) have at least 2/32 inches or greater tire tread.
