## LONG TITLE

## General Description:

This bill modifies the Uniform Driver License Act by amending provisions relating to the federal REAL ID Act of 2005.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 53-3-104.5 is enacted to read:
53-3-104.5. Legislative finding -- Prohibition on implementing REAL ID Act.
(1) As used in this section, "REAL ID Act" means the REAL ID Act of 2005 enacted by the United States Congress as part of the Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Defense, the Global War on Terror, and Tsunami Relief Act, Pub. L. No. 109-13.
(2) The Legislature finds that the United States Congress' enactment of the REAL ID Act into law:
(a) is inimical to the security and well-being of the people of this state;
(b) will cause unneeded expense and inconvenience to the people of this state; and
(c) was adopted in violation of the principles of federalism contained in the Tenth

(3) (a) The state may not participate in the implementation of $\hat{\mathbf{S}} \rightarrow[$ :

(4) This Section does not preclude the division from complying with provisions of the

REAL ID Act that are already:
(a) adopted by administrative rule; or
(b) authorized under this code.

## State Impact

Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriations.

## Individual, Business and/or Local Impact

Enactment of this bill likely will not result in direct, measurable costs and/or benefits for individuals, businesses, or local governments. Individuals may be required to obtain alternative identification acceptable to the Federal Government (a passport card or book) for official purposes such as accessing Federal facilities and boarding Federally regulated commercial aircraft. Current costs for a passport card are $\$ 35$ for those under age 16 and $\$ 45$ for those age 16 and over.
