28	Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah, two-thirds of all members elected to each
29	of the two houses voting in favor thereof:
30	Section 1. It is proposed to amend Utah Constitution Article XI, Section 6, to read:
31	Article XI, Section 6. [Municipalities forbidden to sell waterworks or rights.]
32	[No municipal corporation, shall]
33	(1) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2), a municipality:
34	(i) may not, directly or indirectly, lease, sell, alien, or dispose of any waterworks, water
35	rights, or sources of water supply [now, or hereafter to be] owned or controlled by [it; but all
36	such] the municipality; and
37	(ii) shall preserve, maintain, and operate those waterworks, water rights, and sources of
38	water supply [now owned or hereafter to be acquired by any municipal corporation, shall be
