[May 12, 2009] May 11, 2010, may not become a lobbyist or engage in lobbying that would

require registration as a lobbyist under Title 36, Chapter 11, Lobbyist Disclosure and

Regulation Act, for one calendar year, beginning on the day the state official leaves office and ending on the one-year anniversary of that day.

[(2) This section does not apply if the former state official engages in lobbying on behalf of:]

[(a) himself; or]

[(b) a business with which he is associated, unless the primary activity of the business
