9	This bill modifies provisions of the Budgetary Procedures Act that address fees.

33	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
34	Section 1. Section <b>63J-1-504</b> is amended to read:
35	63J-1-504. Fees Adoption, procedure, and approval Establishing and
36	assessing fees without legislative approval.
37	(1) As used in this section:
38	(a) (i) "Agency" means each department, commission, board, council, agency,
39	institution, officer, corporation, fund, division, office, committee, authority, laboratory, library,
40	unit, bureau, panel, or other administrative unit of the state.
41	(ii) "Agency" does not mean the Legislature or its committees.
42	(b) (i) "Fee agency" means any agency that is authorized to establish fees.
43	(ii) "Fee agency" does not mean a higher education enterprise operation.
44	(c) "Fee schedule" means the complete list of fees charged by a fee agency and the
45	amount of those fees.
46	(d) "Higher education enterprise operation" means a business unit of a state institution
47	of higher education that is financially self-supporting.
48	(2) Each fee agency shall[: (a)] adopt a schedule of fees assessed for services provided
49	by the fee agency that are:
50	[(i)] (a) reasonable, fair, and reflect the cost of services provided; and
51	[(ii)] (b) established according to a cost formula determined by the director of the
52	Governor's Office of Planning and Budget and the director of the Division of Finance in
53	conjunction with the agency seeking to establish the fee[;].
54	(3) Except as provided in Subsection (6), a fee agency may not:
55	(a) set fees by rule; or
56	(b) create, change, or collect any fee unless the fee has been established according to
57	the procedures and requirements of this section.
58	(4) Each fee agency that is proposing a new fee or proposing to change a fee shall:

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59	[(b) (i)] (a) present each proposed fee at a public hearing, subject to the requirements of
60	Title 52, Chapter 4, Open and Public Meetings Act; [and]
61	[(ii)] (b) increase, decrease, or affirm each proposed fee based on the results of the
62	public hearing;
63	(c) except as provided in Subsection (6), submit the fee schedule to the Legislature as
64	part of the agency's annual appropriations request; and
65	(d) where necessary, modify the fee schedule to implement the Legislature's actions.
66	[ <del>(3) A fee agency may not:</del> ]
67	[(a) set fees by rule; or]
68	[(b) charge or collect any fee without approval by the Legislature unless the fee agency
69	has complied with the procedures and requirements of Subsection (5).]
70	(5) (a) Each fee agency shall submit its fee schedule or special assessment amount to
71	the Legislature for its approval on an annual basis.
72	[(4)] (b) The Legislature may approve, increase or decrease and approve, or reject any
73	fee submitted to it by a fee agency.
74	[(5) (a)] (6) After [the] conducting the public hearing required by this section, a fee
75	agency may establish and assess fees without first obtaining legislative approval if:
76	[(i)] (a) (i) the Legislature creates a new program that is to be funded by fees to be set
77	by the Legislature; [and]
78	(ii) the new program's effective date is before the Legislature's next annual general
79	session; [or] and
80	(iii) the fee agency submits the fee schedule for the new program to the Legislature for
81	its approval at a special session, if allowed in the governor's call, or at the next annual general
82	session of the Legislature, whichever is sooner;
83	[(iii)] (b) the Division of Occupational and Professional licensing makes a special
84	assessment against qualified beneficiaries under the Residence Lien Restriction and Lien
85	Recovery Fund Act as provided in Subsection 38-11-206(1)[-]; or
86	[(b) Each fee agency shall submit its fee schedule or special assessment amount to the
87	Legislature for its approval at a special session, if allowed in the governor's call, or at the next
88	annual general session of the Legislature, whichever is sooner.]
89	(c) Unless the fee schedule is approved by the Legislature, the fee agency may not

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90	conect a ree set according to this subsection after the adjournment of the annual general session
91	following the session that established the new program.]
92	(c) (i) the fee is a new, or a change to an existing, financial processing fee that is
93	charged or assessed by a non-governmental third party in addition to other governmental fees;
94	<u>and</u>
95	(ii) the new total or changed fee is submitted to the Legislature for its approval at a
96	special session, if allowed in the governor's call, or at the next annual general session of the
97	Legislature, whichever is sooner.
98	[(6) (a) Each fee agency that wishes to increase any fee by 5% or more shall obtain
99	legislative approval for the fee increase as provided in this subsection before assessing the new
100	fee.]
101	[(b)] (7) (a) Each fee agency that wishes to [increase] change any fee [by 5% or more]
102	shall submit to the governor as part of the agency's annual appropriation request a list that
103	identifies:
104	(i) the title or purpose of the fee;
105	(ii) the present amount of the fee;
106	(iii) the proposed new amount of the fee;
107	(iv) the percent that the fee will have increased if the Legislature approves the higher
108	fee; [and]
109	(v) the estimated total annual revenue change that will result from the change in the
110	fee;
111	(vi) the account or fund into which the fee will be deposited; and
112	[(v)] (vii) the reason for the [increase] change in the fee.
113	[(c)] (b) (i) The governor may review and approve, modify and approve, or reject the
114	fee increases.
115	(ii) The governor shall transmit the list required by Subsection $[\frac{(6)(b)}{(7)(a)}]$ , with any
116	modifications, to the Legislative Fiscal Analyst with the governor's budget recommendations.
117	[(d)] (c) Bills approving any fee [increases of 5% or more] change shall be filed before
118	the beginning of the Legislature's annual general session, if possible.
