40	Section 1. Section 9-17-101 is enacted to read:
41	CHAPTER 17. HUMANITARIAN SERVICE AND EDUCATIONAL AND

43	<u>9-17-101.</u> Title.
44	This chapter is known as the "Humanitarian Service and Educational and Cultural
45	Exchange Restricted Account Act."
46	Section 2. Section 9-17-102 is enacted to read:

49	(1) There is created in the General Fund a restricted account known as the
