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8   **LONG TITLE**

9   **General Description:**

10           This bill modifies the Election Code by amending provisions related to overseas  
11 military absentee voting.

12   **Highlighted Provisions:**

13           This bill:

- 14           ▶ allows an overseas military voter to apply for an absentee ballot electronically;
- 15           ▶ authorizes a county clerk to accept a ballot application for one general election
- 16 instead of two general elections; and
- 17           ▶ makes technical changes.

24           **20A-3-406**, as last amended by Laws of Utah 2006, Chapter 264

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26   *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

27           Section 1. Section **20A-3-406** is amended to read:

28           **20A-3-406. Absentee ballots for military personnel and citizens living overseas --**  
29 **Federal postcard applications for ballot.**

30 (1) (a) [~~Applications for absentee ballots for military voters that are~~] An application  
31 for an absentee ballot for a military voter who is located in the United States shall be filed in  
32 the county clerk's office no later than the Friday immediately before the day of election.

33 (b) [~~Military personnel~~] A member of the military voting an absentee ballot at the  
34 office of the clerk shall apply and cast [~~their~~] the absentee ballot no later than the day before  
35 the election.

36 (2) (a) (i) [~~Military voters~~] A military voter stationed overseas and an overseas citizen  
37 [~~voters~~] voter shall file an application for a ballot with the county clerk no later than 20 days  
38 before the date of the election.

39 (ii) The application for an overseas military voter under Subsection (2)(a)(i) may be  
40 filed electronically as provided in Section 20A-3-408.5.

41 (b) Upon receipt of a properly completed [~~written~~] application for an absentee ballot  
42 signed by [~~any~~] a military voter or an overseas citizen voter, the county clerk shall mail an  
43 appropriate ballot to the military voter or overseas citizen voter.

44 (c) [~~The~~] At the time the ballot is furnished, the county clerk[~~, at the time he furnishes~~  
45 ~~the ballot,~~] shall record, in a record book provided for that purpose[~~;~~]:

46 (i) the name and home address of the military voter or overseas citizen voter to whom  
47 the ballot is mailed[~~;~~];

48 (ii) the address [~~mailed to, and~~] to which the ballot was mailed; and

49 (iii) the date [~~of mailing~~] the ballot was mailed.

50 (d) If the military voter or overseas citizen voter sends [~~his~~] the absentee ballot  
51 application to the lieutenant governor, the lieutenant governor shall forward the application to  
52 the county clerk of the county where the military voter or overseas citizen voter is entitled to  
53 vote.

54 (e) If the county clerk rejects the application for an absentee ballot from a military or  
55 overseas citizen voter, the county clerk shall inform the voter of the reasons for rejecting the  
56 application.

57 (3) [~~Any~~] A military voter or overseas citizen voter who is physically disabled [~~so as to~~

58 ~~be]~~ and unable to see or write may apply for a ballot by having a commissioned,  
59 noncommissioned, or petty officer not below the rank of sergeant[;] or other person authorized  
60 to administer oaths to apply for a ballot on the voter's behalf.

61 (4) (a) A federal postcard application issued under the authority of any Act of  
62 Congress or federal regulation is acceptable, when properly executed, as an application for a  
63 ballot under this chapter.

64 (b) The county clerk shall accept the completed postcard application as an application  
65 for ballots for each election for federal office held in the next [~~two even-numbered years~~]  
66 general election and shall send the applicant a ballot for each of those elections, as required by  
67 Section 20A-3-407.

68 (5) The county clerk shall retain the application for use at the time the ballot is  
69 received from the military voter or overseas citizen voter.
