LONG TITLE
General Description:
This joint resolution of the Legislature expresses support for the construction of a
Heritage Center in Escalante, Utah, and for improvements to the Hole-in-the-Rock
Road, to highlight the journey of the San Juan/Hole-in-the-Rock colonizing expedition
during the winter of 1879-80 and to preserve the history of the most difficult
colonizing expedition in all of the West.
Highlighted Provisions:
This resolution:
• expresses support for the Escalante Heritage Center's effort to preserve the history
of the Hole-in-the-Rock pioneers, the history of the early explorations of the
Escalante Valley, and the settlement of the town Escalante in 1876 through the
heroic efforts of members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to
follow the call of their leader to colonize and tame a part of the frontier; and

Hole-in-the-Rock Road.

John Taylor, President of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, to colonize one of

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30	the most remote parts of the Territory of Utah;
31	WHEREAS, taking what these colonizers thought would be a shortcut to the San Juan
32	area, they traveled through the frontier town of Escalante, which was settled in 1876, to the
33	Colorado River where they blasted and chiseled out a road in the crack of the canyon wall,
34	descending one thousand feet to the Colorado River;
35	WHEREAS, while this was the most difficult part of the trek, it was only one of many
36	difficulties they experienced before reaching their destination and establishing a settlement at
37	Bluff, Utah;
38	WHEREAS, what they thought would be a six-week journey took six months;
39	WHEREAS, the road these individuals created on their journey became the first road
40	in the Territory of Utah, traveling from west to east, to be funded by the Legislature, though it
41	cost only a few thousand dollars to purchase dynamite to blast through the walls of the
42	Hole-in-the-Rock;
43	WHEREAS, during the winter of 1879-80, 250 men, women, and children, trailing
44	over 1,000 head of livestock, blazed a trail through 200 miles of the most rugged terrain in the
45	West;
46	WHEREAS, Elizabeth Decker, a member of the colonizing party described it as "
47	the roughest country you or anybody else ever saw. It's nothing in the world but rocks and
48	holes, hills and hollows";
49	WHEREAS, during their six-month journey, the San Juan colonizers were tempered
50	like fine steel for the formidable task of tilling the land and establishing law and order;
51	WHEREAS, in reaching the San Juan area, the colonizers demonstrated unwavering
52	faith and devotion to duty and set the standard for future generations;
53	WHEREAS, in 2002, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints donated nine
54	acres of land in Escalante to build a Heritage Center, and also donated a water meter, which
55	was critical in allowing the project to move ahead;
56	WHEREAS, in 2007, the Richfield office of the Utah Department of Transportation
57	granted the Escalante Heritage Center \$125,000 to do a feasibility study, which was performed

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58	by Landmark Design of Salt Lake City and completed in 2008;
59	WHEREAS, in 2009, the Salt Lake City office of the Utah Department of
60	Transportation granted the Escalante Heritage Center \$500,000 to build the first of four phases
61	of the project;
62	WHEREAS, the Escalante Heritage Center is a nonprofit corporation engaged in
63	raising private and public funds to construct and maintain a center dedicated to preserving the
64	history and heritage of the Hole-in-the-Rock pioneers and the Escalante area;
65	WHEREAS, the state transportation improvement program includes \$200,000 for
66	preliminary engineering to improve Hole-in-the-Rock Road;
67	WHEREAS, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has expressly recognized in an
68	administrative determination in 1988 that Garfield County owns an R.S. 2477 right-of-way for
69	the Hole-in-the-Rock Road;
70	WHEREAS, Garfield County, Kane County, and the state of Utah have valid
71	documentation that this road has been in existence since 1879 and has been in continuous use
72	for over 131 years;
73	WHEREAS, Garfield County, Kane County, and the state of Utah have expended
74	public tax monies to improve and maintain this road and other R.S. 2477 roads in their
75	respective counties for access to BLM and National Park Service-managed lands;
76	WHEREAS, Kane County has filed a Quiet Title Action to secure forever the property
77	right to this road and other roads in the county;
78	WHEREAS, this case, called the Hole-in-the-Rock Quiet Title Action, will be heard in
79	federal court in the near future;
80	WHEREAS, the Garfield County Commission fully supports this endeavor and is the
81	government sponsor of the project;
82	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of Escalante fully support the Escalante
83	Heritage Center in its endeavor to preserve the history and heritage of the area;
84	WHEREAS, the Mormon Pioneer National Heritage Area project has declared the
85	building of the Escalante Heritage Center its top priority project;

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86	WHEREAS, the Escalante Heritage Center Board has received letters of support from
87	officials of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the offices of both Senators Hatch
88	and Bennett, and the office of Congressman Jim Matheson;
89	WHEREAS, the Escalante Heritage Center Board has the support of officials of the
90	Grand Staircase Escalante National Monument, who feel that a science center on one side of
91	the town of Escalante and a history center on the other side would represent bookends of
92	learning for everyone visiting the area; and
93	WHEREAS, Garfield County has received a letter of support from the Grand Staircase
94	Escalante National Monument for road improvements:
95	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah
96	expresses its support for the Escalante Heritage/Hole-in-the-Rock Center Board's efforts to
97	preserve the history of the Hole-in-the-Rock pioneers and the settlement of the Escalante area,
98	and to construct a building in which to tell the story of these historic pioneers and to improve
99	the road over which they traveled.
100	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Escalante
101	Heritage Center Board, the Garfield County Commission, the Mayor and City Council of
102	Escalante City, the Richfield and Salt Lake City offices of the Utah Department of
103	Transportation, Landmark Design, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and to the
104	members of Utah's congressional delegation.
