9	General Description:
10	This joint resolution of the Legislature urges state and local governments to work
11	together to combat and reduce gang activity.
12	Highlighted Provisions:
13	This resolution:
14	<ul> <li>urges state and local governments to take a comprehensive, collaborative, and</li> </ul>
15	communitywide approach to combat and reduce gang activity; and
16	<ul> <li>acknowledges sports, arts, academic, targeted counseling, and employment</li> </ul>
17	programs as a means to counter gang recruitment.

21	Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
22	WHEREAS, the limitless potential of children, youth, and adults is jeopardized when
23	they fall prey to gang recruitment and intimidation;
24	WHEREAS, gang activity jeopardizes the civil rights, safety, and well-being of all
25	members of the community, whether individuals are associated with gangs or not;
26	WHEREAS, gangs become chronic and serious problems in communities where key
27	organizations are inadequately integrated and not available to target gang-involved youth;
28	WHEREAS, gang activity should be understood as a complex socioeconomic
29	phenomena that requires political and educational approaches as well as cultural awareness,

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30 appropriate prevention and intervention, family and community wellness, and gang specialist 31 and police intervention strategies; 32 WHEREAS, the most effective way to address gang violence is through a 33 comprehensive, collaborative, and communitywide approach; 34 WHEREAS, gang activity can be reduced in targeted neighborhoods by incorporating 35 a broad spectrum of research-based interventions to address the range of personal, family, and 36 community factors that contribute to juvenile delinquency and gang activity; 37 WHEREAS, four key concepts for gang prevention and intervention are identifying the 38 needs at the individual, family, and community level and addressing those needs with a 39 coordinated, comprehensive response; conducting an inventory of resources in the community 40 and creating plans to fill in gaps in services and leveraging existing resources to support 41 effective gang reduction strategies; applying research-based programs across appropriate age 42 ranges, risk factor categories, and agency boundaries; and encouraging coordination and integration of resources at the local, state, and federal levels; 43 44 WHEREAS, the goal of primary prevention is to focus on the entire population and 45 high-crime, high-risk communities; 46 WHEREAS, the goal of intervention is to focus on active gang members and their close associates to provide a combination of services and opportunities, while holding these 47 48 groups accountable for their actions; 49 WHEREAS, the goal of suppression is to focus on gang leaders by undertaking 50 aggressive prosecution efforts; and 51 WHEREAS, local, state, and federal resources should be integrated to incorporate 52 state-of-the-art practices in prevention, intervention, and suppression to enhance pro-social 53 influences in the community: 54 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah 55 strongly urges state and local government agencies, through a comprehensive, collaborative, 56 and communitywide approach, to work to reduce gang activity in targeted neighborhoods by 57 incorporating a broad spectrum of research-based interventions to address the range of

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personal, family, cultural, and community factors that contribute to juvenile delinquency andgang activity.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature urges communities, civil rights
groups, media, elected officials, gang prevention specialists, educational, cultural, and law
enforcement organizations, the community, and active gang members to work towards
mediating conflict and suppressing gang violence.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature acknowledges sports, arts,
academic, targeted counseling, and employment programs as a means to enhance the future of
the community and counter gang recruitment.
