Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah, the Governor concurring therein:
WHEREAS, the effects of father-absent households have contributed to poverty,
maternal and child health risks, incarceration, crime, teenage pregnancy, child abuse, drug and
alcohol abuse, lack of education, and childhood obesity;
WHEREAS, father-absent households create a substantial drain on societal and
government resources;



26	WHEREAS, in Utah, many organizations have not been educated on the significant role
27	fathers play in resolving social issues in communities throughout the state;
28	WHEREAS, many fathers have not grasped how they, as role models, impact their
29	children;
30	WHEREAS, to the extent fathers struggle to accept and fulfill their responsibilities to
31	family members, communities in the state are at risk;
32	WHEREAS, a study conducted by the National Fatherhood Initiative reports that the
33	federal government spends \$100,000,000,000 every year to support father-absent households;
34	WHEREAS, the actual amount may be higher because the study did not measure the
35	impact of related costs like the criminal justice system, which is overwhelmed by men who
36	grew up in father-absent households;
37	WHEREAS, any serious effort to address poverty, child abuse, crime and recidivism,
38	drug abuse, teen pregnancy, or lack of education must make restoring fatherhood an integral
39	part of the solution;
40	WHEREAS, a father-absent household is not a single issue, and its social and economic
41	consequences are felt across society;
42	WHEREAS, 25,000,000 men, or one out of three, grow up in homes where their
43	biological father does not reside;
44	WHEREAS, these children are significantly more likely to live in poverty, drop out of
45	school, and engage in risky behaviors; and
46	WHEREAS, government agencies and nonprofit organizations should understand the
47	dynamics of responsible fatherhood programs to most effectively address the impact
48	father-absent households have on families and communities:
49	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, the
