LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill appropriates money for capital facilities.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ appropriates money for capital facilities.

Monies Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates \$113,000,000 from the General Fund for fiscal year 2010-2011 only, to the Capital Budget for Capital Development.

Other Special Clauses:

This bill takes effect on July 1, 2010.

Uncodified Material Affected:

ENACTS UNCODIFIED MATERIAL

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Appropriation.

(1) There is appropriated from the General Fund for fiscal year 2010-2011 only, \$113,000,000 to the Capital Budget - Capital Development.

(2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the money appropriated under Subsection (1) be used in the following amounts for the following capital facilities:

- (a) \$45,000,000 for the Utah Valley University Science Building;



- 28 (b) \$35,000,000 for the Dixie State College Centennial Commons;
- 29 (c) \$29,000,000 for the Salt Lake Community College Administrative Complex; and
- 30 (d) \$4,000,000 for the National Guard Armory Repair.

31 Section 2. **Effective date.**

32 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2010.
